

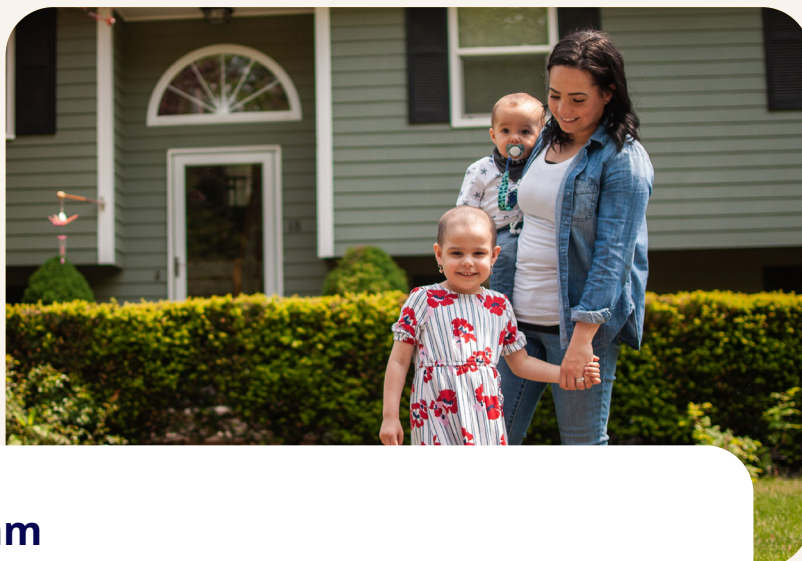
How to Find Temporary Housing **Close to Your Cancer Treatment**

If you're traveling for cancer treatment, there are resources to help you find an **affordable place to stay near the care center**. Here's how to get started:



01

Talk to your care team

Let your social worker, nurse navigator, or another healthcare provider know you need help finding a place to stay.

They may be able to connect you to:

- **Hospital-provided housing** for patients and families
- **Nonprofits** that offer free or low-cost lodging to people traveling for treatment
- **Hotels offering medical discounts** for patients and families

To access these services, try saying, "I'm traveling for treatment and need affordable lodging. Are there hospital housing programs or nonprofits you partner with?"

You can also work with your care team to group multiple appointments into just a few days to limit back-and-forth trips.

Look for discounts

Lodging discounts, including those for seniors and military members, are often available through programs like AAA and employer-sponsored health insurance. Some credit cards also offer discounted hotel rates for members.

Joe's House (joeshouse.org) is a great website for finding hotel discounts and affordable lodging options close to your cancer treatment center.

Visit Family Reach's Financial Resource Center

At FamilyReach.org/gethelp, you can enter your zip code to find local and national support programs, connect one-on-one with a Resource Navigator, access financial tips and guidance, and work with your healthcare provider to apply for available financial assistance.
